
Dear Parents and Wellington Community,

Dear Parents,

I hope that this note finds you well. It was so nice to see so many of you at the Founders' Day celebration – I hope you enjoyed the day. I thought the students performed brilliantly, showcasing the importance the Arts at the school. It was great to welcome Sir Anthony Seldon to Pune and I know he was really impressed by what he saw at the school. His presence illustrated the genuine connections that exist between WCI Pune and the Wellington family of schools.





We are currently exploring opportunities by which our students can connect with other Wellingtonians around the world. One such opportunity which I would like to bring to your attention is that we will be shortly advertising the Wellington Family Summer School offering, based at TWC (UK), which will be open to Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9 students. The 2 week immersive programme commencing in early July is designed to foster a global community of learners, providing students with the opportunity to engage in a diverse range of academic and extracurricular activities. There will be students partaking in the programme from all the Wellington family of schools. Set in the idyllic location of TWC, students will be accommodated in boarding houses where there will be 24/7 exceptional pastoral care and medical provision.

Teaching and learning will be delivered by experienced Wellington practitioners, and there will be an extensive range of sporting artistic and leadership activities. There will also be excursions to royal and historical sites of cultural significance – a truly enriching experience. David Wilson from TWC is in charge of running the Summer School programme and he will host an online session shortly for any interested parents/students. I will send through a confirmed date next week.

There is no doubt that a comprehensive trips programme will form a key part of our educational provision moving forwards. The IGCSE Art class have just been on an academic day trip to a ceramic workshop, and there will be more trips, both day and residential, in the pipeline. More details to follow in due course.
