And that, as they say, is a 'wrap'! Term 1 of the Academic Year 2024–2025 is now complete and what a Term it has been, replete with individual and collective accomplishments of the highest order. It has been a most fulfilling period, book ended by our Founders' Day event in September and the accreditation inspection by COBIS in December (the latter following on from the Early Years success with the Curiosity Approach). I look forward to highlighting the COBIS outcomes in late–January / early February 2025, once the inspectors have produced their final report.





I have especially enjoyed seeing all the academic progress made, across all three schools, and that should be a source of great pride to all. Indeed, the embedding of the IGCSE curriculum in Year 10 is also deserving of mention –well done to all involved in this, both pupils and staff.

Of course, a Wellington education comprises a holistic approach and the Pune 'winter' (and attendant AQI issues) have worked against our provision on occasion. I commend the patience of all involved in CCA and sporting activities; the judgement of Solomon has sometimes been required to balance offering outdoor opportunities with prioritising pupil welfare. It is another reason why I am looking forward to the early months of 2025, when we look to open our large indoor Multi-Purpose Hall (hopefully offsetting the challenges of unpredictable AQI and weather). I will keep all parents informed on the progress of the MPH and other elements of the ongoing campus development.

This first Term, in year two of operation, has also signalled greater maturity in the performing arts, witnessed not only through outstanding internal performances (such as Winter Shows) but also exemplified by joyous events like the Ritz-Carlton Tree Lighting. The pupils' involvement at the Ritz-Carlton, in Christmas carols and readings, was simply superb and a wonderful testimony to how far we have all come since September 2023. Culturally, I greatly enjoyed seeing the parents and audience take such pride in the occasion – roll on many more such highlights in the months to come!

This sense of cultural appreciation was also illustrated in the end of term events like the Winter Show, Santa Dash and the Senior School Talent Show and House Singing Competition. Well done to all! With the Friends of Wellington now more established, and a number of Term 2 events earmarked for parental participation, we hope to really capture this momentum.





I conclude with a sincere thank you to all in the Wellington community, pupils /colleagues /parents, for all your endeavours and support in this Term 1; it is always appreciated, and I am most grateful to everyone.

I wish all in the Wellington family a very Merry Christmas and, of course, a most Happy New Year!
